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Grant Application Process and Presentation from Chris Daniels	
Discussion	<p>To apply for grant funding from the Region 6 Behavioral Health Board, please contact Laurie for a copy of the application, or it will be posted on the RBHB website.</p> <p>Chris Daniels – The original funding for the Hope and Recovery Resource Center came through a grant from the Millennial Fund. There have been 9 centers funded over the state of Idaho. Each center is peer operated and managed by 1-3 employees. Everything that is done at the center is provided for free. There are a variety of different recovery oriented meetings through the week. There are Life skills classes offered, such as, cooking classes through the food bank. The recovery coaching is offered on a fee for services basis if the individuals qualify through BPA or other programs. If not, it is offered for free. There is Computer access for job searching and resume classes.</p> <p>One thing that makes the Hope and Recovery Resource Center unique is its transportation program. They do require some advanced notice; however, they are available to provide transportation for people in the SHARE program at the jail. They are currently working to expand services into satellite offices into at least 5 of the rural outlying counties. They currently have relationships with Caribou County Jail. They are working with people being released and coming back into the community. There is no chance that there will be more recovery centers funded in every county. The HRRC would like to become a regional center. They would like to begin developing recovery coaching in these counties. The proposal will be requesting funds at the level of \$3,000 to get these satellite services out. They will require funding for travel support and to identify space to develop satellite offices and volunteer staff at these locations. Chris will be providing the request and a detailed funding plan at the next RBHB meeting.</p>
