Southeastern Idaho Public Health Confirmed Six Deaths in Southeast Idaho Due to COVID-19

Southeastern Idaho Public Health (SIPH) has confirmed six deaths associated with COVID-19 in southeast Idaho. Three deaths occurred in Bannock County residents. One was a female in her 100's, one was a female in her 50's and the other was a male in his 60's. Two deaths occurred in Bingham County residents one was a male in his 60's and the other a male in his 70's. And lastly, a death in a Franklin County resident who was a female in her 60's. This brings the total to 41 deaths due to COVID-19 in southeast Idaho. Out of respect to these individuals' families, no additional details will be released.

SIPH urges all residents to take precautions to slow the spread of COVID-19. This includes practicing social distancing at all times, wearing cloth face coverings in public places, practicing good hand hygiene, and isolating immediately if you show symptoms of COVID-19.

Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. People with these symptoms may have COVID-19:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
