Southeastern Idaho Public Health’s Weekly COVID-19 Update

For the week of May 18-May 24, Southeastern Idaho Public Health had 68 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. This brings the total of confirmed and probable cases to 17,144. Out of the 17,144 cases, 17,074 have recovered from COVID-19.

There are four confirmed deaths related to COVID-19: a male in his 70’s from Bannock County, a male in his 50’s from Bingham County, a male in his 60’s from Bingham County and a male in his 70’s from Bannock County. This brings the total to 230 deaths due to COVID-19. Out of respect to these individuals’ families, no additional details will be released.

- Get vaccinated as soon as possible.
