## Southeastern Idaho Public Health’s Weekly COVID-19 Update

For the week of January 19, 2022 – January 24, 2022, Southeastern Idaho Public Health had 2,219 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. This brings the total of confirmed and probable cases to 33,284. Out of the 33,284 cases, 29,715 have recovered from COVID-19. There were also 6 confirmed deaths, which brings the total to 461 deaths, due to COVID-19. Out of respect to these individuals’ families, no additional details will be released.
