Southeastern Idaho Public Health’s Weekly COVID-19 Update

For the week of March 22 – March 28, 2022, Southeastern Idaho Public Health had 16 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. This brings the total of confirmed and probable cases to 37,867. Out of the 37,867 cases, 37,339 have recovered from COVID-19. There were 6 confirmed deaths, which brings the total to 508 deaths, due to COVID-19. Out of respect to these individuals’ families, no additional details will be released.
