## Southeastern Idaho Public Health’s Weekly COVID-19 Update

For the week of May 24 – May 30, 2022, Southeastern Idaho Public Health had 58 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. This brings the total of confirmed and probable cases to 38,296. Out of the 38,296 cases, 37,655 have recovered from COVID-19. There are no deaths to report.
